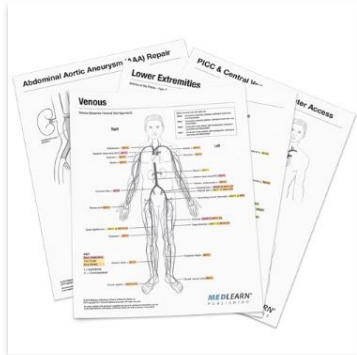


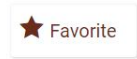
Charts

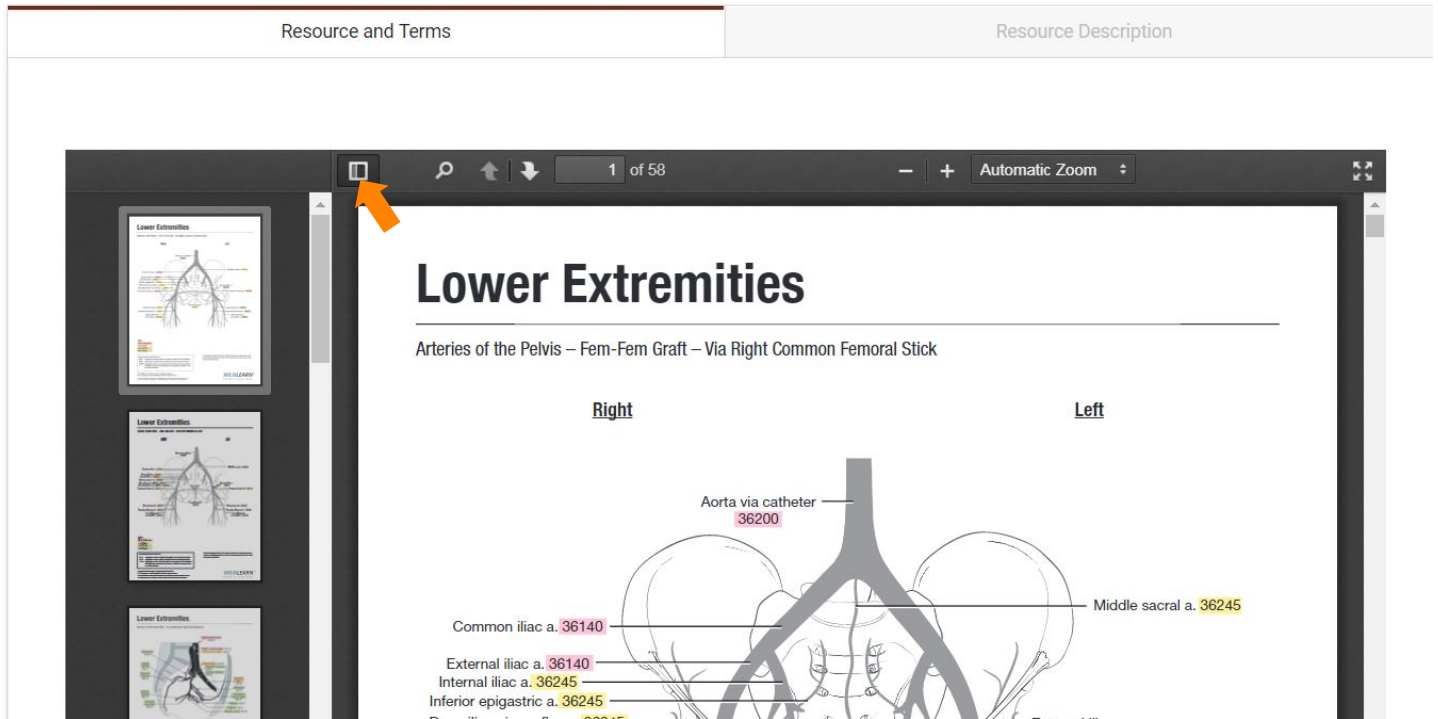

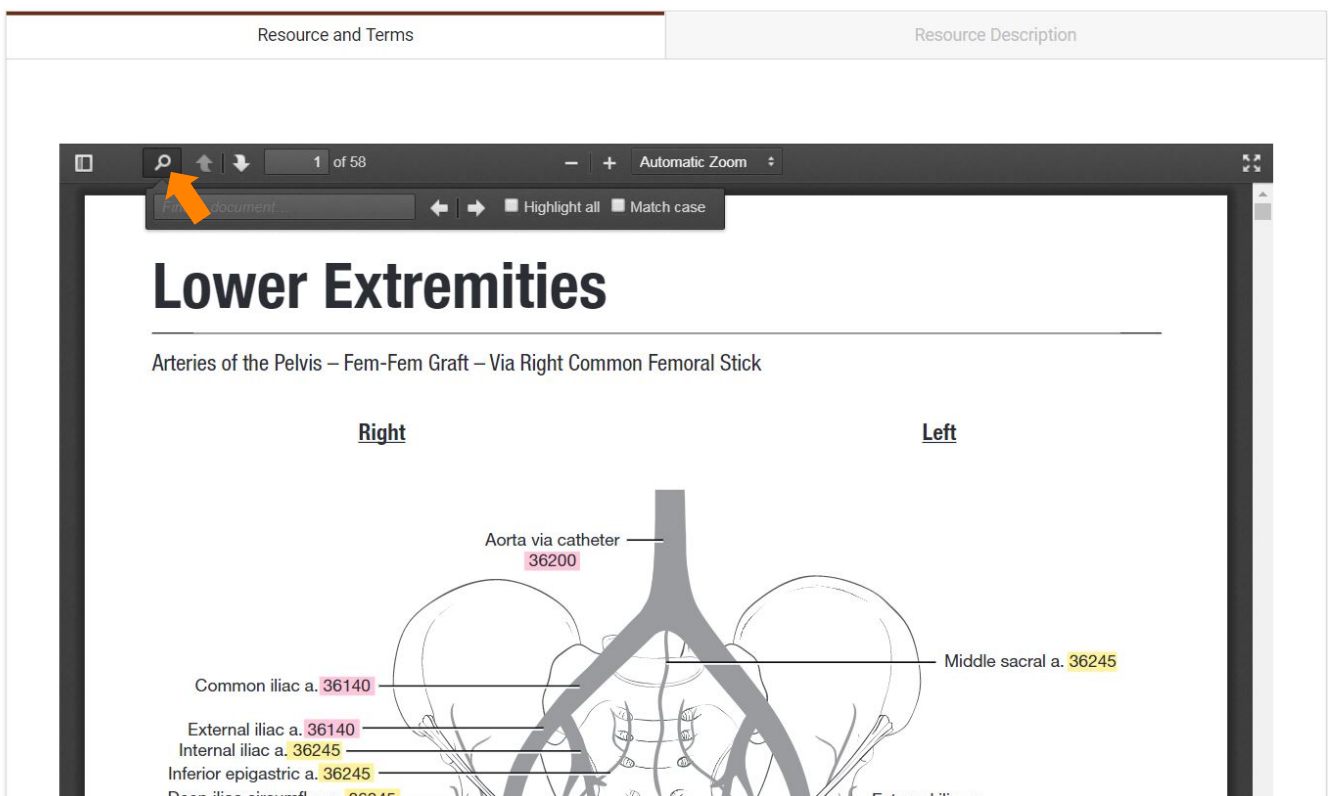

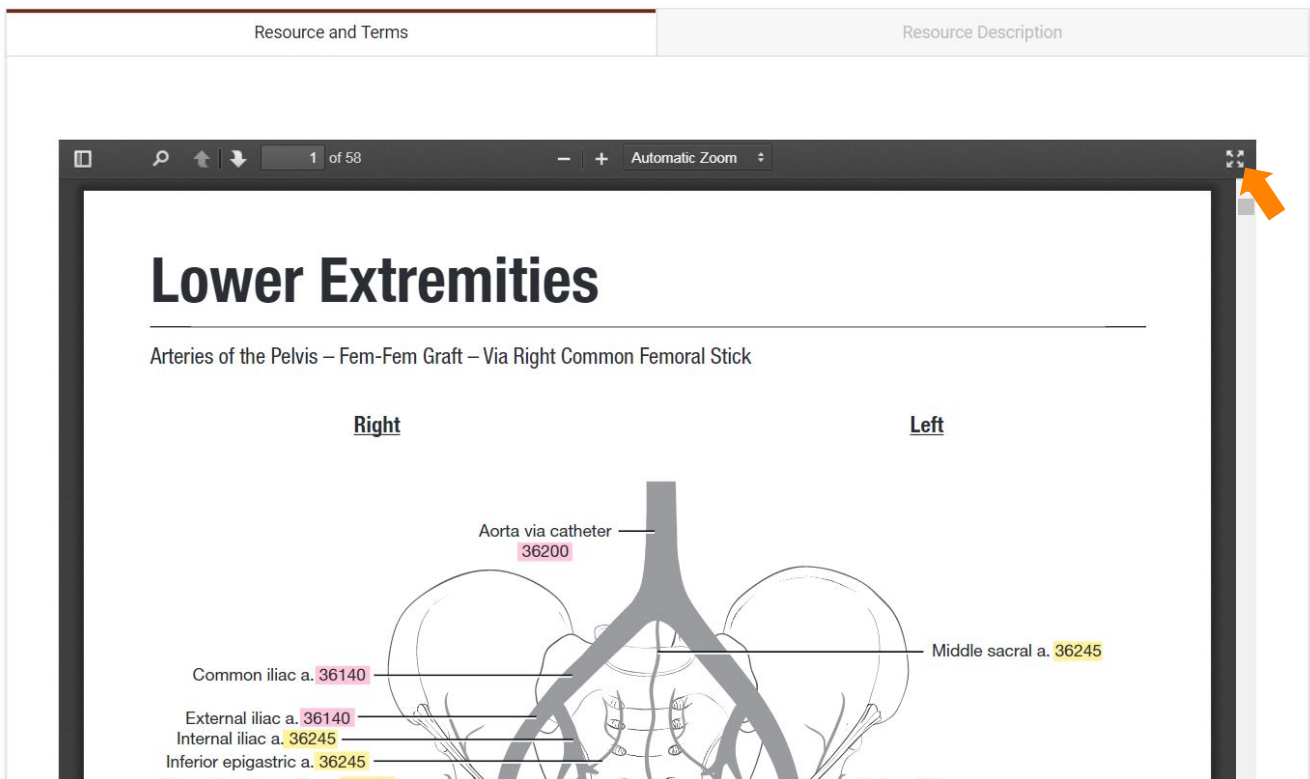
If there's a specific CPT code or term you are looking for you can type that into the search to easily navigate to the information you need.



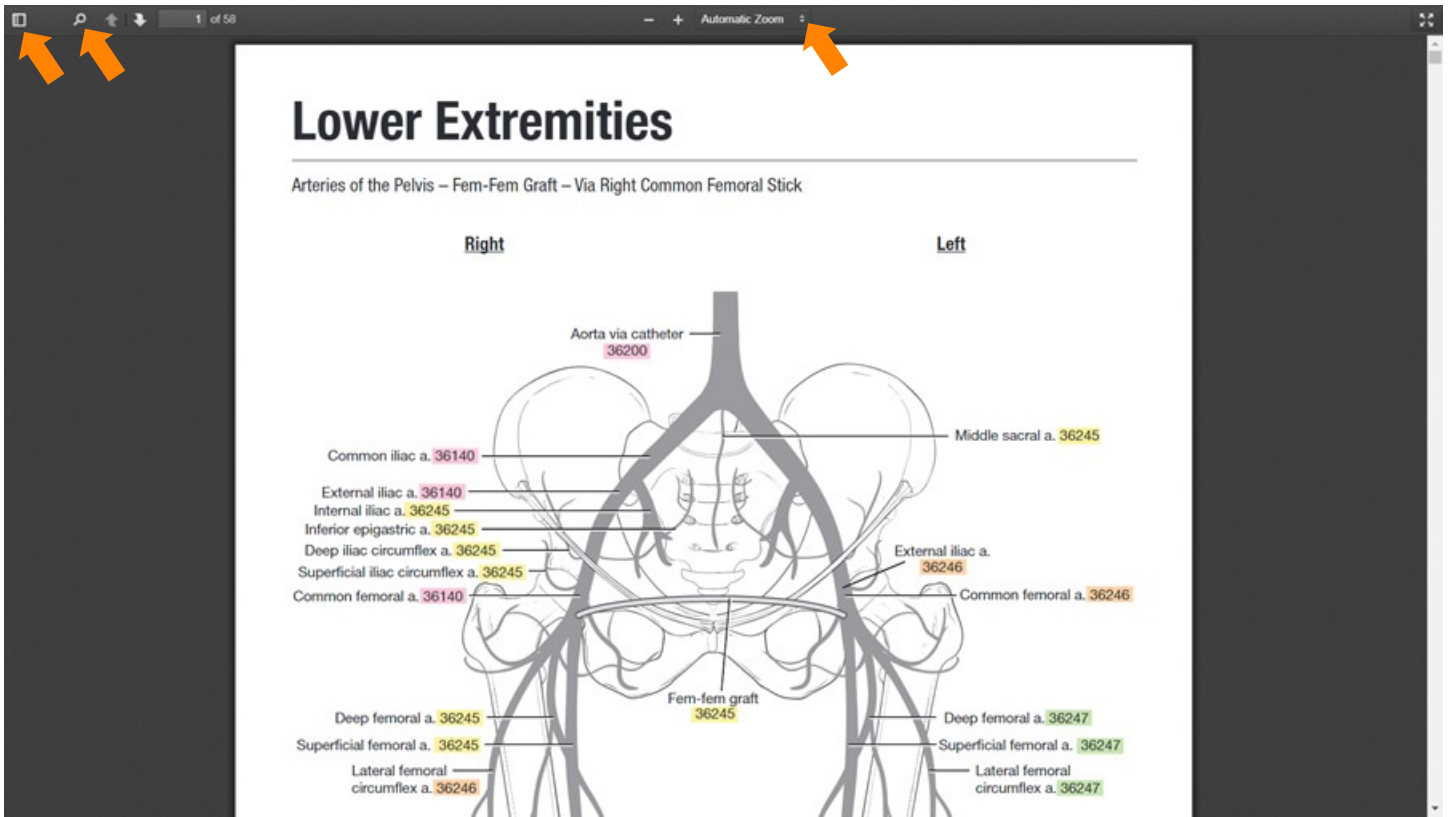
If you want to see something a bit larger you are able to zoom in and increase the chart size, you can zoom back out to your preference for flipping through the charts.



You are also able to open the charts in Full Screen mode which can make reading a little easier. This is the icon in the upper right corner of the screen.



From Full Screen mode, you are still able to search and zoom in and out to your preference and look through the image thumbnails if you would like.



To exit full screen mode click the 'Full Screen On/Off' icon in the upper right corner of the screen.
